

PLAY TO LEARN




Honed over three decades of implementation in public schools, Play to Learn provided instrumental and vocal instruction for students in and out of school time.

Following the New York State Learning Standards, our foundational program ignites musical passion for K-12 students in disciplines including strings, percussion, harp, winds, chorus, and voice.

During 15-30 week residencies, diverse Teaching Artists at the top of their craft work with students to develop technique and foster creativity. In collaboration with our teaching artists, we use a student-centered, inquiry-based approach to promote a positive classroom experience and hands-on learning.

Student efforts culminate in a final "Midori Matinee" attended by friends & family, sparking confidence in newly acquired skills.

Midori & Friends' *Celebrate! Music* program invited young learners to become global citizens in an active exploration of world music. By learning about the richness of cultural traditions, works of art, and musical customs around the globe, in class and through live performances, students cultivated a global perspective that nurtures empathy and understanding.

Celebrate! Music brings engaging world music ensembles and corresponding workshops into New York City public schools. Students experience live artist performances and interactive workshops with Teaching Artists.

JOURNEY TO JAPAN

Journey to Japan is an interactive exploration of Japanese artistic traditions. Designed for all ages, this series presents multi-disciplinary cultural workshops and performances featuring Midori & Friends' artists. These hands-on sessions involved art-making such as calligraphy and origami, and age-appropriate, accessible music education for young students such as ukulele instruction and Japanese folk dances.

Artist-led workshops included:

Taiko drumming, floral arrangement (ikebana), calligraphy, kamishibai storytelling, singing, Japanese dance and origami

NEXTGEN



NEXTGen is a youth leadership & advocacy program which empowers teens through artistic, leadership, and advocacy training with professional musicians and mentors in the fields of finance, tech, law, and government.

Scholarships were provided for students to explore career pathways through private music lessons, masterclasses, and career labs with critical thinkers in diverse fields of study and extraordinary artists, including world-renowned virtuoso violinist, Midori!

Teens sharpened their advocacy skills by practicing storytelling, public speaking, and persuasive writing. The program culminates with a community presentation of their collaborative arts advocacy campaign featuring the next generation of music leaders.





Arianna Ramos joined NEXTGen and discovered her voice through its leadership workshops and her artistry through its musical mentorships. Three years later, at 18, she's already completed two paid music internships through M&F while studying music production at Brooklyn College, successfully translating her newfound confidence into professional experience.




